

Emmaus Borough's Triangle Park Recognized as a Great Place in PA

The Borough of Emmaus may be the only town in Pennsylvania with a triangle at its center.

Now, the Borough's Triangle Park has been selected as a Great Place in PA by the Pennsylvania Chapter of the American Planning Association (APA), which honors communities as part of its Great Places in Pennsylvania initiative. Emmaus was the only Borough to make the list in 2018. The program was started in 2014 and is fashioned after the national APA model that designates Great Places across the U.S.

Honorees were recognized in two categories: Great Public Spaces and Great Greenways or Trails.

According to the APA, Great Places are areas of exemplary character, quality, planning, identity, cultural interest, and community involvement with a sustainable vision. The APA defines a Great Greenway or Trail as a linear parcel of land or right-of-way set aside to preserve or protect open space, scenic landscapes, historical resources, and/or plant or animal habitats. It provides a way of connecting people to parks, schools, downtowns, places of employment, pristine natural areas, and/or historical structures and features. It can be limited to foot traffic or able to accommodate multiple uses.

The three-sided plot of land, which has been part of the Emmaus community since 1759, originally served as the location for crops and livestock to benefit the townspeople and then as the site of a hotel. Following demolition of the hotel in 1923, the Emmaus Triangle was officially established as a park, frequented by people of all ages and commonly referred to as just "The Triangle." A special feature located in the heart of The Triangle is a fountain that is lighted during the evening, May through October. Triangle Park serves as a hub for events, including: Old Fashioned Christmas, SnowBlast Winter Arts Festival, Farewell to Summer Festival, educational presentations, the starting point for foot and bike races, and most recently, the Emmaus Farmers' Market. The Triangle, being centrally located, makes it possible to walk to just about everywhere in the downtown area. The park's wrought iron fence, park benches, fountain, kiosk, and beautiful trees and flowers make the "The Triangle" a natural hub of activity and a meeting place for the community. And we are proud that, although we already knew it was a Great Place, it is now officially recognized statewide as a Great Place in PA.

EMMAUS RECYCLES!

What YOU Can Do to Assist Recycling Efforts in Our Borough

- Recycle all glass, cans, and paper.
- Recycle Plastics labeled #1 – #6. For more information, refer to <https://learn.eartheeasy.com/articles/plastics-by-the-numbers>
- Please remove the caps from your plastic bottles before putting both in the recycling bin, these are recycled separately.
- To Avoid Contamination – please wash out all containers with leftover liquid or food. Contamination in the waste stream is a major problem and complicates recycling efforts. Believe it or not, if a recycling center deems that a load of recycling contains too much contamination, the center completely rejects the entire load, which means it ends up in the landfill!
- Paper Recycling - please avoid recycling shredded paper. Shredded paper is NOT accepted through single-stream recycling (instead, consider composting shredded paper.) DO NOT put plastic bags full of shredded paper into your recycling bin. Shredded paper actually jams the machines at the recycling plants, therefore, they do not accept shredded paper at most locations.
- Don't mix plastic bags in with the

rest of your recycled items. We recommend taking your bags to Weis or Giant supermarkets for recycling.

- Place your recycling in a clearly marked can only. If you need a RECYCLING sticker, please come to Borough hall to pick one up. **Do not place your recycling in large clear plastic bags, these will not be collected!**
- Breakdown cardboard and place it into the largest box, this will help our hauler with more efficient pickups.

Other Reminders About Recycling and Garbage Collection:

- Please remember to place your garbage out the night before your collection day. We have had several calls from residents stating that their garbage wasn't picked up...often due to the fact that they did not put it out in time. Please make sure that you are only putting it out the night before, and not two or three days before.

- Large bulk item pick-up - Please contact Whitetail Disposal Inc. directly at 610-754-0103 for all large bulk items such as sofas and mattresses. They send a special truck for bulk items, so scheduling ahead of time will help them coordinate their efforts.
- In the Fall Newsletter we will supply you with some information regarding Dumpster Day as well as a collection day for Household Hazardous Waste, such as oil, chemicals, paint, pesticides, and other items that require special disposal. We are currently planning on a collection event for these items in Fall.
- We appreciate the patience of the community with the

transition to our new hauler. Whitetail Disposal has been working hard to work out the kinks and provide our community with the best possible service. We understand that your refuse bill increased. In our last newsletter, we explained the increase and everything that goes into your bill. Your bill is not simply calculated by the cost of the garbage collection, but it also includes the costs of operating our compost site, leaf and yard waste collection, Christmas tree collection, Electronics Recycling, Dumpster Day, and Household Hazardous Waste programs.



EMMAUS RECYCLES!

Residents can drop off E-waste at the E-waste dumpster located beside the Public Works Department garage on Kline's Lane. The site is open on the **2nd Monday of the month from Noon – 6:00 p.m.** starting in March, 2019. The site will be closed from December through February. Guidelines for dropping off items: Whitetail Disposal

employees will not unload items from vehicles. Residents and businesses must remove all items from their vehicles without the assistance of Whitetail Disposal.

- Items will only be accepted on designated days during designated hours.
- Residents visiting the site shall show the attendant their identification signifying that they are a Borough resident. Items from outside the Borough of Emmaus will not be accepted.
- Residents will be able to drop off three electronic devices at no charge. Exceeding three electronic devices being dropped off in a single month by a resident or business within the Borough of Emmaus will cost an additional \$10.00 per item.

It also allows Borough officials to serve as mentors to students who will be future leaders in their communities. The program allows a high school student to literally sit on Borough Council and participate in the government process. 

AFTER 15 Years at the BB&T Lot, The EMMAUS MARKET MOVES TO THE TRIANGLE



Big changes are happening in Emmaus on Sundays this spring... in fact, they've already happened. As of the end of January, the BB&T Bank on Main Street closed, and some changes had to be made. The Emmaus Farmers' Market is no longer at the BB&T parking lot and the farmers and vendors have decided to move their 16th season to Triangle Park, aka, "The Triangle".

The Emmaus Farmers' Market Board and vendors concluded The Triangle was the best option for the market. So why the move after 15 years of success in the BB&T lot? The location change was necessary due to the bank closing, meaning the Market could no longer use the parking lot every Sunday. The Borough reached out to members of the Market board to discuss options, and were fully supportive of finding a space. Thanks to Shane Pepe, Teri Sorg-McMannon and the rest of the Emmaus Borough for all the support in making this move to The Triangle a reality.

Jen Schuster, Marketing and Events Coordinator for The Emmaus Market said, "This is an exciting opportunity for the Market, and although it's bitter-sweet, I think the change will be a great thing for the Market and the Emmaus community."

Some residents and market customers expressed concerns in regards to parking, bringing their dogs, the size of the Triangle, and the location in general.

PARKING: Parking won't really change. The bank had on street parking and open lots behind Schantz Funeral Home & Baked, and there are just as many options at the new location, if not more. The BB&T lot may even be available, as well as surrounding lots such as Wells Fargo. Baked is still an option, as well as all the streets around the Triangle.

PETS: Triangle Park is pet friendly, just be sure to clean up after your pet and let others know if your pet is friendly with other dogs and people.

SIZE: The vendors mapped out a well thought out plan, and will be set-up on 4th Street and also the Triangle's parking area, blocking off areas keeping customers safety in mind.

TRIANGLE: The inside of the Triangle will have the Music Tent, Market Tent, community tables, and give customers plenty of room to roam and sit. This space will leave options to grow the market as well.

The Market will continue to feature monthly events just like last season, including free yoga, food demos, free samples, kids themed events, and more. One highlight for this season will be National Farmers' Market Week in August, where they'll have food demos, face painting & henna tattoos, and fun activities for kids. There will be live music every Sunday, as well as chalk for kids to draw at the Triangle. When visiting the Market, be sure to stop by the Market Tent to see Jen Schuster, Marketing and Events Coordinator to sign up for the newsletter and get your #RoosterRewards card punched. She has plenty of #RoosterRewards Loyalty Cards, Market Merchandise consisting of sweatshirts, t-shirts (adult & children sizes), seasonal posters, reusable bags for shopping, and even umbrellas due to the many rainy days the market had last season. The Market Tent also has free items such as 2019 magnets highlighting every market for the year, scrapers, magnetic notepads, stickers, and more. Jen is always available for questions and loves featuring customers photos with their new metal Rooster, to share on Facebook and Instagram.

The Emmaus Farmers' Market runs year-round, with their Winter Market from January-April on the 2nd & 4th Sundays from 10 a.m. - NOON. The 16th Season will kick off on May 5th (yes, Cinco de Mayo) and run until November with regular hours from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. The Market also remains open every weekend in December, from 10 a.m.- NOON. 

Permits are Required

Spring is right around the corner and now is the time that many of us think about starting those home improvement projects we have been planning all winter long. If you are preparing to start a backyard project, please remember that permits are required for many projects. The Borough has a Zoning Ordinance and Building Code that contain requirements for many of the outdoor home improvement projects you plan to undertake. Permits are required for: roof repairs, building repairs or remodels (causing structural changes), footers, foundations, framing, plumbing, electrical, mechanical, signs, fences, sheds, dumpsters, demolition, solicitation/peddling, driveways, pools, and zoning. Please remember that if you are planning to install a swimming pool, any swimming pool over twenty-four inches (24") inches in depth and/or has pumping equipment requires a zoning, building, and electrical permit.

Applications for all permits are available online! Download applications for permits from the Borough's website at: www.borough.emmaus.pa.us. On the website home page, click on, "About Emmaus". On the drop-down menu click on "Documents/Forms" and choose which application you need. Simply fill it out and bring the completed application into Borough Hall at 28 S. 4th Street. If you are not sure if you need a permit, or have any questions about permits, please call the Code Enforcement Officer at 610-967-1322.



VISIT THE 1803 HOUSE IN 2019

The 1803 House is one of Emmaus' historic treasures. It is located at Minor and Keystone Streets at the foot of South Mountain. The House was built by Jacob Ehrenhardt, Jr., son of a Pennsylvania Pioneer, Jacob Ehrenhardt, Sr. who descended from Johannes Ehrenhardt. Jacob Ehrenhardt, Sr. was one of the two founders of Emmaus in 1759. The house is celebrated every year in July.



Before you plan a visit to the 1803 House, please visit our website at www.1803house.org and take a virtual tour of the house, where you will learn about the house's architecture, how it was built, who lived in the house, the Moravian lifestyle, the lives the Ehrenhardts, and the house's antiques. You will also learn about the archaeological dig, which began in 2012, and will be completed this spring. Through the dig we continue to uncover architectural facts, colonial lifestyle evidence, and add more to the story of the 1803 House and what it was like to live in Emmaus in 1803. After completion, a description of what was found will be provided.

In May the 1803 House is planning a spring social event. As you tour the house, during this event, there will be Pennsylvania wines for tasting, food for sampling, and local musicians serenading you. It will be an evening to enjoy at the 1803 House. Please visit the 1803 House website for more information about this special event.

Also, in spring, the 1803 House will be the site of a third-grade student education program where students will learn about colonial era life and what it was like to be a child in Emmaus in 1803.

The 1803 House is continuously working to restore and maintain its history including the window opening restoration project which will begin in Spring. This work is being funded by grants and the generous donations of the community. The 1803 House - come visit it; support it; and enjoy it – a treasure in the community!

The Knauss Homestead Preservation Society is thrilled to announce that it has received some valuable historic property. Elizabeth Knauss Thomas, PHD., from Boston, Massachusetts, has donated a quilt from the late 1800's stitched by a group of ladies in Bethlehem for her Grandmother as a wedding present. Ms. Thomas is a direct descendant of Sebastian Knauss, one of the founders of Emmaus, thru his son Abraham. This gorgeous family heirloom is on display at the Knauss Homestead. Also donated by Ms. Thomas is a cabbage shredder made by her Grandfather John H. Knauss. For more information about the newly donated items and the Knauss family heritage please visit our website.

The Society has also received a Dower Chest from the 18th Century. This chest was purchased and donated by Army Captain Damon Knauss, a direct descendant of Sebastian Knauss. Due to his frequent moves, Captain Knauss feels the Knauss Homestead is where the Dower Chest rightly belongs. In addition to the purchase and donation of this treasure, Captain Knauss commissioned a 20" X 30" oil-based painting of the Knauss Coat of Arms. The painting is beautifully framed and on display at the Knauss Homestead.

News from the Shelter House

If you are a longtime resident of the Borough, or you just moved into Emmaus, and would be interested to learn some of the local history, take some time and stop in at the Emmaus Public Library's front desk.

The Shelter House Society of Emmaus and the Emmaus Public Library have partnered in a project to provide back issues of the Shelter House Society's yearly publication the "Hearthstone", for sale to the public.

The "Hearthstone", first published by the Society in 1954 and continually published yearly as a benefit of Society membership, has provided hundreds of historical articles on life and activities within the Borough. These booklets provide information on the early 1700's, the years of the establishment of this Moravian village which became the Borough of Emmaus, letters from a Civil War veteran who was from Emmaus and why the name changed from Emaus to its present spelling of Emmaus. Learn how the railroad and the iron foundries were important to the area plus other manufacturing operations that provide employment for Borough residents.

The "Hearthstone" publications are available for \$5.00 per copy. There is a 5% discount for purchases over three copies. An index of topics for the years 1968 through 2018 is available at the Library's front desk. Some years are limited in quantity. Proceeds of the "Hearthstone" publications are shared with the Emmaus Public Library.

Located mid-way up the South 4th Street hill, the Shelter House maintains the historic 1734 log cabin, reported to be the oldest continually inhabited Lehigh County residence. Tours are available by calling the resident curator at 610-965-9258. There is no charge for Shelter

House tours; however, donations are accepted to help in the maintenance of the building and property.

Colonial Woodsman visits the Shelter House

In late spring of 2018, the Shelter House participated with the Knauss Homestead, 1803 House, and God's Acre, in the second Annual Education Project arranged by The Heritage Alliance of Emmaus.

The Education Project is designed to bring local history to school students in third grade in the East Penn School District. Each historic entity creates an educational program pertinent to their historic period. The Shelter House, being the oldest historic house (1734) in the program, selected three lessons: learning about early newspapers (the broadside), hearing a story about the first settlers of Shelter House, and meeting a Colonial woodsman on the newly created sensory path on Shelter House grounds.

The woodsman explained to the students how the early settlers felled the logs to build their houses, how they found food, and how they managed to survive and thrive in the wilderness.

The woodsman's finale for the Colonial education project, was to fire his muzzle loader into the woods. The kids loved it.



The woodsman, Ken Biles, is no stranger to the Shelter House as he had provided the program at one of our Patriots' Day Dinners. Biles razzle-dazzled the audience by displaying an assortment of Native American tools and artifacts. Biles' finale at the Patriots' Day Dinner was starting a fire with a small pile of wood chips which he set ablaze by rubbing two sticks together. Imagine the folly of starting a fire inside Citizens Fire Company #2.

Using White Oak lumber from a fallen tree in Shelter House woods, Biles created a new cellar door to replace the badly aged one. Biles forged the strap hinges that secure the door. Those who view the new cellar door are amazed at the authenticity.

Since retiring as an educator, Biles visits schools locally and regionally demonstrating aspects of life in Colonial times.

2018 Emmaus Ambulance Corps Year End Report

The Emmaus Ambulance Corps responded to 2,580 Emergency Calls for help in 2018. The busiest time of day for emergency calls was between 12 noon and 5:00 p.m. The Emmaus Ambulance Corps operates a second ambulance crew daytime Monday – Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

The Emmaus Ambulance Corps also has crew members covering wheelchair and stretcher transports. There was a total of 612 of these in 2018. These transports were for doctors' appointments and transporting patients from the hospital to home or to a long-term care facility.

Just a reminder: We will bill your insurance company for emergency transports, however; payment for those services may be sent directly to you. The Emmaus Ambulance Corps is a non-participating provider.


It is your responsibility to forward any payments received from your insurance company along with any deductibles or co-pays due to us.

Non-Emergency wheelchair and stretcher transports are usually a non-covered service by most insurance companies. You are responsible to pay for all non-covered services. Grass, Weed & Tree Trimming Regulations

During the course of the year, especially as the growing season begins, the Borough receives complaints regarding lack of property maintenance and uncut grass complaints. As a reminder, a property owner is responsible for the property from the front curbline to the rear curbline. Please help keep our community beautiful by cutting or removing the weeds at your curb.

The Borough of Emmaus Ordinance 675, Chapter 10, Part 3, Section 301, states that weeds and grass may not exceed 6" in height. After given proper notification by way of a door hanger, or certified and regular mail and failure to cut the grass and/or weeds within the allotted 5 days after notification, the property owner may be subject to a fine of up to \$300 per offense per day, together with costs for removing, spraying, trimming, or cutting by the Borough or its contractor. A delinquent property owner is also responsible for associated costs, plus administrative and legal fees as permitted by law.

The Borough of Emmaus Ordinance 675, Chapter 25, Part 1, Section 103, requires that any tree on private property or along the streets or alleys must have a clear height of 14 feet over the street and 10 feet over the sidewalk. Also, any trees, shrubs or hedges located in the clear sight triangle cannot exceed 2 feet above grade. After proper notification by way of certified and regular mail and failure to trim overgrown trees within the allotted 10 days of notification, the property owner may be subject to a fine of up to \$300 per offense per day, together with costs of trimming by the Borough or its contractor. A delinquent property owner is also responsible for associated costs, plus administrative and legal fees as permitted by law.

Curbside Yard Waste Pick-up

The Borough's waste hauler, Whitetail Disposal, **does not** collect yard waste. Yard waste pick-up is available through the Emmaus Public Works Department. **Residents desiring curbside yard waste collection must use the following procedures:**

From Monday, April 1, 2019 through Thursday, October 31, 2019, yard waste will be collected by Public Works personnel on **Mondays and Thursdays**, except holidays*. Yard waste must be placed at the curb in **approved yard waste bags**, which can be purchased at most hardware stores. Yard waste is limited to organic biodegradable materials such as grass, leaves, hedge trimmings, leafy plants and small sticks and twigs. Separate grass, twigs, and hedge trimmings into different bags. **Bags contaminated with stones, trash, mulch or dirt will not be collected. Material not separated properly will not be collected. Bags exceeding 50 lbs. will not be collected.**

Historic photographs of Main and Chestnut Streets in downtown Emmaus show that these two thoroughfares have always been bordered by trees. Back then, street trees provided shade and shelter along the tidy rows of homes and businesses. Trees offer the same benefit today while making the downtown triangle an attractive destination for shoppers.

In January, Emmaus Borough Council approved a plan that will keep downtown Emmaus green for future generations. The plan, developed by members of the Shade Tree Commission, is a guide for replacing the Borough's existing trees as they reach the end of their natural lifespan, as is the case with some of the Borough's 'Bradford' Pear trees. With this plan in hand, Emmaus will be able to apply for grants to help fund the replacement of declining trees.

The street tree plan governs 184 curbside tree "wells," or planting pockets, that extend along Main and Chestnut Streets between the Emmaus Public Library and CVS Pharmacy, including Triangle Park. Currently, the majority of street trees in this eight-block corridor are 'Bradford' Pears and HoneyLocusts, both of which will be phased out in the new plan.

In their place, the Shade Tree Commission recommends four superior varieties of trees: Trident Maple, 'Ivory Silk' Tree Lilac, 'City Sprite' Zelkova, and 'Okame' Ornamental Cherry. In general, the replacements are smaller than the current trees and therefore better suited to the scale of the planting pockets. They are small enough to not interfere with overhead wires, and because their roots are less aggressive than those of the current trees, they are less likely to lift sidewalks and curbs as their roots grow.

This is not a project that needs to be taken on all at once—in fact, members of the Shade Tree Commission envision the implementation taking two decades or longer, with individual trees being swapped out as the need arises. Many of our current trees are healthy and problem-free. We want to keep these healthy trees as long as we can. But as trees decline and die or begin to lift pavement, this plan will provide the blueprint for their replacements.

In 2019, the plan calls for nine new trees to be planted downtown. Seven are destined for locations that are empty or that contain dead trees, and the other two will replace trees in decline.

Call Before You Cut

Healthy, well-maintained trees add to property values and the quality of our lives. Before planting, pruning, or removing any tree within the public right-of-way (within 12 feet of the curb), Emmaus property owners must request a permit from the Shade Tree Commission. Driving Safety Tips for the Spring from the Emmaus Police Department

With winter fading into the background and better weather all around, you would think the roads would finally be safe again. This isn't always the case.

Seasonal showers, migrating animals, and poor road conditions can create unpleasant complications out on the road. Use the tips below to your advantage and you will be that much more prepared for any seasonal driving dangers that come your way.

Rainy days and flooding

Spring rain brings slippery road conditions and flooding. According to the Federal Highway Administration, rain was a culprit of 46 percent of all weather-related crashes from 2005 to 2014, and wet pavement in general accounted for 73 percent.

What makes rain and wet pavement so dangerous? For one, slippery roads reduce your car's handling and increase the distance it takes to stop (up to 4 times normal stopping

distance). Big puddles can also cut down on tire traction and could lead to hydroplaning.

Hail Season

Beware of hailstorms, even small hailstones can shatter windshields, and raining balls of ice are never good for the roads.

Winter road wear and tear

Winter wreaks havoc on the roads. Snow plows, salt, sand, and the aftermath of ice can all leave roads a bit battered. Once snow melts away, expect to drive over new potholes.

Animal activity

Animals are incredibly active during the spring. Some are emerging from hibernation, and others are entering mating season. This could mean that more animals are crossing streets and roaming around. Many animals, especially deer, are most active at dawn or dusk.

More bicycles on the road

Spring also brings cyclists out of

hibernation. Driving alongside cyclists can make traffic maneuvers, from turning right to parallel parking, more dangerous.

Spring tune ups for your cars

- Check your lights: Since spring rain hinders driving visibility, make sure all your lights work, including: headlights, taillights, backup lights, turn signals, parking lights, and brake lights.
- Replace your wiper blades: Worn-out wiper blades may not be up to the task of clearing water away from your windshield. Check your wiper blades and replace them if necessary (usually once a year).
- Check your tire pressure: Harsh winter weather can deflate your tires. Make sure you have enough air in them once spring rolls around. (As a bonus, proper tire pressure can also help you increase your mpg.)

Call Before You Dig

If you are planning on digging, call Pennsylvania One Call System, Inc. (POCS) three business days before you dig at 1-800-242-1776 or 8-1-1. The call center is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, every day of the year. PA Act 287 as amended requires excavators as well as private landowners to call POCS three days prior to any type of digging occurring with powered equipment. Mark your excavation area in white paint before calling with a dig notification. By calling, you allow the facility owners the opportunity to locate and mark their underground facility in advance of the planned excavation (gas and liquid pipelines will mark underground facilities using yellow stakes, flags, or paint).
